After some difficult times, we ended up divorcing in 1983. But we were very blessed to stay friends. Over the phone I got to know Stacy and was glad that they were together! She gave him so much and of course he gave her a lot of grief (smile). We had been trying to get them to Missouri where my father, my family and myself lives. It seemed everything seemed to come up or happen to stop it. I guess it wasn't meant to be. He wanted to see all of us one last time before anything happened to my parents!
